Basis of Country-of-Origin Information (COI) Research

"... well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion ..." [Emphasis added]



The lack of information about a specific incident or situation does NOT mean that it did not happen or that it does not exist.

Country of Origin Information (COI)

Definition:

- Country of Origin Information is reliable, timely, and publicly available country information that aims to accurately and objectively report on country conditions in the countries from which refugee claimants originate.
- COI is used by decision-makers, claimants, and their legal advisors to assess claims to refugee status or international protection.
- It does not and could not identify a claimant or any other person who is not a public figure, even if the information is given to another Canadian government department or an external agency; and if the information were made public, would not seriously endanger the life, liberty or security of the claimant or any other person.



Country of Origin Information (COI)

Country conditions:

- the human rights and security situation
- the political situation and the legal framework
- cultural aspects and societal attitudes
- the humanitarian and economic situation
- events and incidents
- geography



COI as Evidence: Considerations

- Search for reliable documents
 - Originating from reputable persons or organisations
 - Recent publication date
 - Methodology indicated
 - Sources provided
 - Author cited
 - Corroborated by other documents
- Make use of advanced search tools when searching the internet or other databases




Research Challenges

- Sources available only in foreign language
- Obtaining information from governments whose resources are scarce
- Lack of:
 - International presence (NGOs and media) and
 - Local presence (civil society and media)
- Finding information on local events/situations
- Finding evidence of legislation being enacted and enforced



Source of COI at the IRB

- Because conditions in a country often change, the IRB produces regular information about "countries of origin".
- Decision-makers may consult this information as part of their work. The information is available in the following formats:






Responses to Information Requests









Sources of COI: Refworld

Search: COI

- Wide variety of sources selected from UN, NGOs, Governments, International Organisations and others monitoring and reporting on country situations
- Assists the decision maker on issues of credibility and the objective situation in a country of origin
- Source selection takes into account global coverage, relevance and proven reliability, objectivity and timeliness.





Use of COI in Decision Making

Analysis – COI:

- COI may support or contradict the asylum seeker's allegations.
- May impact credibility and/or the objective basis for the claim.
- If the COI does not support the allegations, question asylum seeker at the interview.
- Weigh contradictory evidence (COI and other) and explain the reason to prefer one source over another. Assign probative value.
- Properly cite sources.

Use of COI in Decision Making

Factors to Consider:

- the date of the evidence;
- the author's identity;
- the source of the author's information;
- the qualifications/expertise of the author:
- the reputation of the publication/publisher;
- any bias of the author/publisher;
- any spelling errors on official documents;

- consistency with other reliable evidence;
- other publications by the same author;
- the author's knowledge of the subject matter;
- whether the document has an impartial tone;
- the extent to which the document is based on opinion;
- the purpose for which the document was prepared;



Use of COI in Decision Making

COI is notably relevant in the analysis of:

- Credibility
- State Protection
- IFA
